HOW THE POLL WAS CONDUCTED AND THE MARGIN OF ERROR CALCULATED

June 30, 2020

This CBS News/YouGov survey is based on a national sample of 1,130 registered voters who were contacted between June 28-29, 2024. All respondents participated in an earlier national survey of 1,881 registered voters fielded June 17-21, 2024.

The sample of 1,130 registered voters was weighted by gender, age, race, and education based upon the U.S. Census American Community Survey, and the U.S. Census Current Population Survey, as well as Presidential vote and partisan identification and weighted to account for differential response rates. The weights range from 0.1 to 6.1, with a mean of 1 and a standard deviation of 1.

The *margin of error* (a 95% confidence interval) for a sample percentage p based upon the recontacted sample is approximately ± 4.2 points. It is calculated using the formula

$$\hat{p} \pm 100 \times \sqrt{\frac{1 + CV^2}{n}}$$

where CV is the coefficient of variation of the sample weights and n is the sample size used to compute the proportion. This is a measure of sampling error (the average of all estimates obtained using the same sample selection and weighting procedures repeatedly). The sample estimate should differ from its expected value by less than margin of error in 95 percent of all samples. It does not reflect non-sampling errors, including potential selection bias in panel participation or in response to a particular survey.
